2024 RULES & REGULATIONS for Open Rabbit Classes

- Eligibility: Open to all rabbit exhibitors.
- 2. A pen fee of \$4 per head is required with registration If a rabbit entry becomes ill prior to the fair, a refund may be, granted or it may be replaced by another rabbit if a slip is obtained by a vet.
- 3. No rabbit may compete in more than one conformation class within Department 9 Rabbits.
- 4. Each exhibitor will be limited to no more than a total of four entries in this department.
- 5. 6. All entries must be pre-registered by August 1.
- All entries will be accepted in the order they are received, according to their postmark, until all pens are filled.
- Rabbits are to arrive on Monday, August 19 between 1pm and 5pm in the rabbit barn.

 All rabbits must be checked in by the rabbit chairman. 7.

- Rabbits must remain in their pens at all times while on exhibit, except during judging.
 Rabbit exhibitors are responsible for their own feed and care of their rabbits during fair week (only bedding will be 10.
- Classes 100 through 500 will be judged as grade stock. All breeds recognized by the American Rabbit Breeders Association (ARBA) are eligible for competition and will be judged according to the latest standard of perfection. 11.
- 12. Classes 600 through 1000 will be judged as pedigreed stock--pedigrees showing three generations of purebred history, must be provided at check in on Monday.
- Junior rabbits must be at least 12 weeks old and under 6 months by 1st day of the fair. 13.
- For Classes 600-1000 all Litters must be between 4 to 6 weeks old by 1st day of the fair. 14.
- 15. In Pedigree Classes 600-1000 all rabbits should be tattooed in the left ear.
- Rabbits are released to exhibitors at 10pm on Saturday, August 24.

DEPARTMENT 10

4-H AND VOCATIONAL

Eligibility: 4-H club members must have passed their eighth birthday but must not have passed their 19th birthday as of January 1st. Exhibitors must be 4-H members carrying a project in the field in which they wish to make entry and be under the supervision of their State University Cooperative Extension Service by their designated deadline. Open Class rules, regulations and entry times apply for all 4-H and Vocational Livestock Projects. All animals shown by a 4-H exhibitor must be owned by that exhibitor or have a lease agreement and must be carried as a 4-H project. Be sure to use only grooming products that are approved for use on meat and dairy animals when fitting your animals for show. Unapproved products may contain ingredients that result in unacceptable residues in the meat or milk. For exhibits, including live animals, please refer to the Beaver County 4-H Project Directory and/or the project benefit or project completion requirements not listed on the website or Department 10 information information. Project Directory and/or the project book for project completion requirements not listed on the website or Department 10 information printed from the website. **EXHIBITORS MAY NOT SHOW IN BOTH DEPARTMENTS 10 AND DEPARTMENT 11**.

Note: Entry fees will not be charged for 4-H entries, only when the animal has been entered in open or youth classes.

All Market Animal projects must go through the Beaver County Stockman's Club

Section A-9 - BREEDING RABBITS

- Eligibility: 4-H club members must have passed their 8th birthday but not have passed their 19th birthday as of January 1st. Exhibitors must be 4-H or FFA members carrying a project in the field in which they wish to make an entry, and be under the supervision of their State University Cooperative Extension Service or Beaver County FFA Chapter by June 1st. Rabbits shown in Department 10 may not be shown in Department 11-Youth-Breeding Rabbits.
- No rabbit may compete in more than one conformation class within this department.
- Each exhibitor will be limited to no more than a total of four entries within this department.
- 4. All entries must be pre-registered by August 1.
- 5. All entries will be accepted in the order they are received, according to their postmark, until all pens are filled.
- All rabbits shown by a 4-H exhibitor must be owned by that exhibitor, and at least one rabbit must be carried as a 4-H project. 6.
- If a rabbit entry becomes ill prior to the fair, a refund may be granted or it [as long as it is not the rabbit project entry] may be replaced by another rabbit if a slip is obtained by a vet.
- Rabbits are to arrive on Monday, August 19 between 1pm and 5pm in the rabbit barn. All rabbits must be checked in by the rabbit chairman. 8
- Rabbits must remain in their pens at all times while on exhibit, except during judging. 10.
- Exhibitors should wear a show coat or apron with a white long-sleeved shirt and black pants. Shoes should be totally enclosed. No jewelry permitted, with the exception of post earrings. Long hair must be pulled back.
- 12. Rabbits shown in the showmanship classes must be rabbit projects carried by the exhibitors.
- Rabbit exhibitors are responsible for their own feed and care of their rabbits during fair week (only bedding will be provided).
- Classes 100 through 500 will be judged as grade stock--crossbreeding is highly discouraged.
- Classes 600 through 1000 will be judged as pedigreed stock--pedigrees showing three generations of purebred history, must be provided at check in on Monday.
- Junior rabbits must be at least 12 weeks old and under 6 months.
- Litters must be between 4 to 6 weeks old.
- In Pedigree classes 600-1000 all rabbits must be tattooed in the left ear.
- Rabbits are released to exhibitors at 10pm on Saturday, August 24.

Rabbit Health Rules and Requirements

Out of State Rabbits Requirements:

Rabbits originating from a Commonwealth, State, Territory or Country identified as being affected by RHDV-2 within the 12 months prior to the start of the exhibition may not enter.

No rabbits or their products, such as meat, pelts, hides, carcasses or other items, and no equipment, exposed feed, forages, or conveyances or other items or associated materials may enter the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania from a Commonwealth, State, Territory, or Country where Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease (RHD) has been diagnosed in the prior twelve (12) months or there is a reasonable suspicion it exists unless they meet the following requirements:

- 1. All live rabbits must be accompanied by an ICVI and must be examined by an accredited veterinarian within the seventy-two (72) hours prior to the date of shipment to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.
- 2. The ICVI must include statements by an accredited veterinarian certifying that all rabbits in the shipment have been examined for and found free of infectious, contagious, or communicable diseases.
- 3. All rabbits have originated from a single premises that has no signs of infectious, contagious or communicable disease in rabbits.
- 4. There have been no movements of rabbits onto the premises of origin within the 90 days prior to the date of shipment and the rabbits have had no contact with wild or captive rabbits other than their cohorts in the 90 days prior to the date of shipment.
- 5. No rabbits or their products, such as meat, pelts, hides, carcasses or other items, and no equipment, exposed feed or conveyances or other items or associated materials may enter the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania from a premises exposed to, contaminated with or known to be affected with RHD, or where there is a reasonable suspicion, the disease exists or the rabbits have been exposed to or infected with RHD.

PLEASE NOTE: Pennsylvania allows vaccination of rabbits for RHDV-2 and recognizes that other states, territories, and countries may also allow the vaccination of rabbits. However, vaccination of rabbits does not excuse the rabbit/ rabbit products derived from /or equipment used for them, from meeting our import requirements above which are associated with our Rabbit Hemorrhagic Disease Interstate International Quarantine Order.
